



Evidencing the impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium 2018-2019

Purpose of the sports grant:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

To promote an awareness of the importance of healthy lifestyles.

To have a broad range of coverage for all skill areas across both Key Stages.

To develop a consistent approach to assessment of the skills across the school, with an emphasis on supporting evidence.

Funtime Activities (YR- Y6)	September- October 2018	£2,000	Specific focus on skill development in gymnastics. Class teachers completed evaluation forms in relation to the quality of the sessions (forms on trello) Overall positive responses. Technical terminology and application of gymnastic positions was developed too as requested.
Freddy Fit Workshop (YR- Y6)	2 nd October 2018	£410	To raise awareness of healthy lifestyles and the importance of healthy eating and exercise. Freddy led active sessions with all classes. Children reported " it was really fun" " I liked exercising to music" " my heart was racing after it" Children received healthy living booklets to take home.
Funtime activities for ASC	September- October 2018	£540	Children took part in dance led activities. ASC mentioned that it wasn't being led effectively. RMc and EL met with HC- suggested the sessions be delivered with a KS1 and KS2 focus. This will be trialled next term- EL to report on the effectiveness of this.
Communitree Curriiculum Day Y4	13 th November	£350	Children developed practical skills- with a link to their Roman enquiry in history. Children make weapons which they showcased and presented in their class assembly.
