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Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for working with us across this week as we have started to put in place our learning offer to all pupils both at home and in school. It has been lovely across the last two days to connect with our children who are learning at home in our assembly sessions and class teachers have delivered their first Microsoft Teams sessions of the new term today across all classes. Children in school have also settled into the new routines we have put in place.

From Monday our full remote learning timetable will start across all classes in school. Within each child's calendar on Teams their full week of sessions with their class teacher will be scheduled so that you have an overview of when these are taking place each day. This will stay consistent each week so that you can begin to build a routine at home. These live sessions will ensure that phonics, English, maths and topic teaching is being delivered to all the children at home, which directly mirrors the teaching inputs that will be delivered in school to those children who are accessing provision.

The physical packs that have been developed and can be collected on Monday at the times stated on Parent Hub are only for those children who are learning at home, as they contain the physical equipment that children need and resources such as number lines or word mats. These packs also contain some physical work books that children can complete alongside their taught lessons so that children can reinforce their learning.

Class teachers will set the same weekly assignments for children to complete in and out of class. In Reception and year 2 these will be through Tapestry, so that parents can submit the work for the assignment as photographs or videos and class teachers can provide feedback. From year 2 upwards, assignments will be set on Microsoft Teams. It is really important that the assignments are completed so that class teachers can provide feedback. Throughout the day class teachers will be monitoring teams and Tapestry so that they can respond and mark children's work.

Alongside this, teachers will be signposting and sharing some learning videos that children are able to watch to support their learning each week. These videos will come from sources such as The Oak Learning Academy and White Rose Maths. The idea with videos is that these can be watched at any time. Next week by Wednesday, we will also be sending home a suggested timetable for home learning for each class to support parents with an overview of how you could structure your child's day with the daily live inputs alongside the pack, assignments and other resources. This will just be a guide to help you think about how the day at home could be organised as you start to create a structure for your own circumstances. If you need further support with this, please do get in touch with us and class teachers will be happy to help you.





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Our learning offer, which is made up of both a remote and an in school provision will be the same. The same learning inputs will be delivered by class teachers across the week and the assignments that are set on Teams and in Tapestry are what the children in school will complete, so that there is consistency across both learning groups. No additional teaching inputs will be delivered in school that are not being done through Teams.

Next week will be our first full week of running both learning provisions simultaneously. At the end of the week we will reflect on how things have gone and continue to adapt our curriculum as everyone settles into the new routines. I will also be looking at some of the other communication functions Microsoft Teams has to further develop the platform during this period of home learning.
