

DID YOU KNOW? A two week holiday in term time means that the highest attendace you can achieve is 94.7%

We check all children's attendance fortnightly and we will write to parents if children's attendance falls below 97%.

Of course there are times when children need to stay at home but good attendance is so important.

REMINDER: if your child is poorly, or absent for an appointment, please endeavour to contact school before 8.30am to advise.

If by 9.30am no message has been received, the school will phone home to try to secure an explanation (leaving a voicemail message) as well as sending a ParentHub message. Where the school is unable to make contact the absence will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. If no contact has been made by 10.15am the School Attendance Officer/Safeguarding team may decide to make a home visit if there are further concerns.

Punctuality

Please help your child by ensuring they arrive at school on time. Children that arrive late miss key learning and start of the day. Just being a few minutes late can leave children feeling anxious and unsettled for the first half of their school day which can be detrimental to their learning.

We monitor persistent latecomers and if your child has been late for 5 sessions or more we will send a letter home to bring it to your attention. If your child is late for 10 or more sessions, you may be asked to a meeting with school and could also be issued with a fine.

Label items

All clothing needs to be labelled with children's names. We do not have space for lost property in school. Items that are named can be returned to children easily.

There is a lot of lost learning time due to lost items of uniform.

Reminders

- Our cloakrooms are small so please <u>only</u> send small rucksacks in KS2 and books bags in KS1.
- PE kit needs to be kept in school and in a labelled pump bag. Children mislay items so please help us by labelling all items.
- A water bottle is needed and must contain water not juice. Please ensure these are taken home and washed each day.
- Air Up bottles are not permitted in school.
- Jewellery needs to be removed before school. Children are permitted to wear a simple watch and small plain stud earrings.
- Full uniform is to be worn following our school policy.
- It is important we have high expectations for smart uniform and behaviour.
