Home Learning Grids

For Reception to Year 6 new Home Learning Grids will be available today on SeeSaw and Parent Hub.

At Unsworth, our Home Learning approach focuses on building strong basic skills. We appreciate how busy family life can be with hobbies and quality time together, so we encourage families to prioritise sharing a **love of reading**. Alongside this, we recommend a "little and often" approach to practising age-appropriate basics, such as:

- Phonics and Spelling
- Maths skills – number bonds, basic arithmetic, and times tables

Our aim is to make home learning manageable and meaningful, supporting children's progress while keeping family time at the heart of learning. Speaking and listening about learning is also proven to be highly beneficial for children's development.

All other options on the Home Learning Grid are linked to class projects. Learning for these can be shared on SeeSaw and will be celebrated in class.
